Healing Relationships: The Principles of Reconciliation

Matthew 6:14–15 - "For if you forgive others for their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions."

Fixing or Healing?

Conflicts in a "Biblical Church"? Roman, Corinthian, Galatia, Ephesus, ...

What is Forgiveness? "Forgiveness is the release, on the part of the creditor or offended party, of any expectation that a debt will be repaid or that an offender will receive punishment for an offense ... Forgiveness can also be expressed by stating that one will not 'remember' (zakar) the offense or 'count' ($h\bar{a}šab$) the offense against someone" (Lexington).

Pursuing Relational Peace is applying the forgiveness you possess in Christ (from your own sins) toward every other person in your life and thus addressing from Gospel-grace all personal conflicts. These are the steps that organize the principles of Healing Relationships:

Six Principles of Reconciliation that Heal Relationships: PEOPLE

1.		Peace through Forgiveness (Mt. 6:14-15; Rom. 12:18; Heb. 12:18)
2.		Yourself Before Accusing Others (Mt. 7:1-5).
3.		Defined with Law and Evidence (Mt. 5:29ff, 16:23, 18:6, 18:16).
4.		of Confrontation (or Not) -
	•	we may forgive without confrontation (Eph. 5:32; 1 Pet. 4:8).
	•	we may forgive through confrontation (Mt. 18:15ff).
5.		in Confrontation (James 1:19–20; Prov. 18:13; Mt. 18:15ff).
6.		a Renewed Mind (Phil. 4:4-9; Rom. 12:1-2; Psalm 1).
